Ontario Language Curriculum

Last spring Ontario revised the elementary Language Curriculum based on recommendations from the Ontario Human Rights Commission's Right to Read inquiry and report. Here is a brief introduction to some of the changes.

Language development is central to a student's intellectual, social and emotional growth, which is a key element of the new curriculum.

The strands (areas of focus) have been updated to include - Literacy Connections/Applications, Foundations of Language, Comprehension (Understanding and Responding to Texts), and Composition (Expressing Ideas and Creating Texts).

Grades 1 to 3 (explicit word work instruction and transferable skills) – word reading, spelling, phonemic awareness, phonetics, and alphabetical knowledge to develop language foundations – emphasis on printing (Gr.1.&.2), cursive (Gr.3)

Grades 4 to 8 (explicit word work instruction and transferable skills) – learning/application of orthographic, morphological, vocabulary knowledge and fluency, to develop reading/spelling skills – emphasis on cursive and word-processing skills.

Family Mental Wellness Tips for the Holiday Season

The holidays can be a stressful time for all families, but can be an especially trying time for children and youth who have previously, or who are currently, struggling with mental health issues. Changes in routine can cause or increase anxiety for some kids and reduced sunlight and time spent outside can also trigger bouts of depression.

So, while this should be "the happiest time of the year," here are some tips from Children's Mental Health Ontario (CMHO) that might help everyone enjoy their holidays a little bit more:

- Plan your schedule in advance allow your child time to prepare for each event, party, or outing.
- Make sure everyone is eating and sleeping try to maintain routines as much as possible.
- Communicate openly about feelings save some time to check-in and discuss how they are feeling.
- Have realistic expectations adjust plans when necessary.
- Find a quiet place and plan for boredom ensure they have a quiet spot with a selection of activities.
- Don't worry about other people's judgements this helps you remain calm and not overreact.
- · Take care of you maintain healthy routines and boundaries.

- Deadline to apply to *college* is February 1st. The nonrefundable \$95 application fee must also be paid by this date.
- Deadline to apply to university is January 15th. The refundable \$150 application fee must also be paid by this date.
