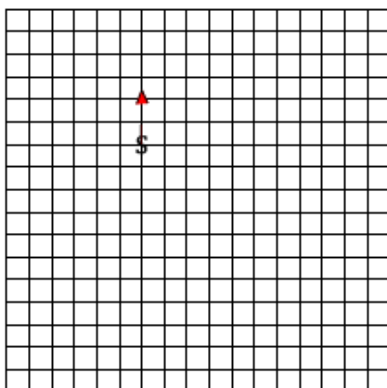
Problem of the Week Problem B Crossing Paths

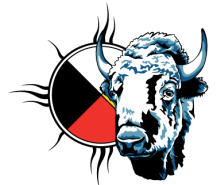

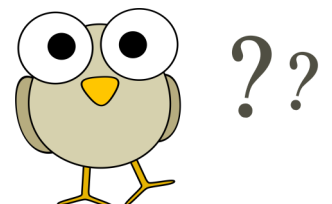
