



The Labourers' Local 183 Scholarship Trust Fund has been awarding scholarships to hardworking members, the children and grandchildren of Local 183 Members and Retirees for many years.

Since 2006, the Labourers' Local 183 Scholarship Trust Fund has awarded 907 scholarships in excess of 7.6 million dollars to our members, children and grandchildren of the Local 183 membership.





Labourers' Local 183 Scholarship Trust Fund

The goal of the Labourers' Local 183 Scholarship Trust Fund is to assist members, the children and grandchildren of Local 183 Members and Retirees, in obtaining a high-quality post-secondary education.

Provided that the Scholarship Applicant meets the foregoing requirements, and the member, parent or grandparent is in good standing with LiUNA Local 183; submissions must be on time and properly completed in order to be received for review.

The Independent Academic Committee will review all submissions based on the criteria established. Disabled applicants should include a brief note indicating their disability.

All candidates will be notified in writing of the decision of the Committee, and this will be mailed to the address provided on the application. The communication of decisions is generally completed by the end of September each year. After all notifications have been made, an awards dinner will be held in honour of the successful applicants, at which time the Scholarships will be formally presented.

Awards will be made to successful candidates subject to administrative requirements established by the Board of Trustees and amounts awarded may be subject to variation.


Applicants must be registered as a full-time attendee and maintain appropriate academic standings to receive future payments.


Except as necessary for the procedures described herein, all applications and information will remain strictly confidential.

Eligibity & Rules

Any student who has graduated is already attending school or who will be graduating from an Ontario High School or an equivalent program and will be attending or is already attending a recognized post-secondary institution, such as a College or University in the coming school year, and is a member, the child or grandchild of a Local 183 member or a retiree in good standing, is eligible to apply for consideration. Spouses of members are not eligible.

Please note that anyone who was awarded a Local 183 Scholarship in the past is not eligible to apply again, even if the full amount of the past award was not received. Anyone who has applied for a Local 183 scholarship in the past and was not awarded is eligible to re-apply. If approved, the Scholarship will be awarded for the years remaining on your planned program.

The sponsoring member must be actively at work or retired at the time of application submission.


Award


A number of scholarships will be awarded on an annual basis to successful applicants as chosen by the Fund's Independent Academic Committee. The current Scholarship is as follows:

The Board of Trustees will determine the duration and financial amount based on the number of applicants and funds available.

One scholarship award is dedicated on an annual basis to a successful applicant with a disability or disabilities.

Areas that require less time to complete will only receive the award for the actual length of the program. The total value will not be averaged over a shortened period of time.





Grading Criteria

An Independent Academic Committee will review all applications received.

Scholarships will be awarded based on the following criteria and **not limited** to academic grades:

- Essay submission;
- Involvement in community activities including: multicultural, religious, athletics and any other organizations;
- Paid or volunteer work experience (with references) not including volunteer work done for school credits;
- Secondary school or University / College marks and academic achievements;
- Life experience;
- Any additional information.

Submission Instructions

Please take these steps to ensure that your application is received in full.

Only complete applications that are received on time will be considered:

- Fill out the personal information form and attach any documents pertaining to community activity, paid work or any relevant information.
- Completely answer the essay component. Your essay is to be typed and double-spaced, on one of the topics provided on the following page.
- Certified original academic transcript from the Secondary school, College or University you last attended (including final marks number of credits will not be accepted); Academic transcripts will be accepted via email (scholarship@liunacare183.com) or mail (address on page 7) directly from the secondary school, college, or university you last attended.
- Please note only original transcripts from academic institution will be accepted.
- Letter of acceptance (copy) from the College or University you will be attending in the upcoming academic year.
- Any other relevant documentation such as a resume, reference letters, awards, etc.

Essay Format

Complete an essay on one of the topics listed below. Each essay should be a maximum of 500 words and must include information gathered from research as well as personal opinion. Please type and double-space your essay. If typing is not possible, neatly print and double-space your work.


Each essay should be written in a standard format consisting of 6 paragraphs:

- >> 1 introductory paragraph;
- >>> 4 body paragraphs each reflecting a different point of the topic;
- >> 1 concluding paragraph;

Essay Topics

Please complete your essay on 1 of the 4 topics listed below:

- In your opinion, why are second-generation immigrants in Canada not choosing careers related to apprenticeships or skilled trades? Is skills training well supported in our school system?
- In the province of Ontario are careers in construction, both residential and commercial, directions that are easily understood by students planning for their futures?
- Describe the contribution that skilled trades have made in building Canada into a leading G-7 Nation.
- A new Crown agency dedicated to addressing a shortage of skilled labour trades was introduced in the province of Ontario. What do you think has caused this shortage? What might this new agency do to attract workers to enter the skilled trades?
